Interfaces directly to CAN



Contents of the kit

- 1 x SmartCAN2 module
- 1 x 13-pin socket with seal and fixing screws
- 1 x complete set of wires
- 1 x fuse tap connector with 15 amp fuse
- 2 x Red Positap connectors
- 1 x ring (earth) terminal
- 1 x Blue butt connector
- 2 x snap connectors (Scotchloks)

The TF2323 SmartCan2 towing module connects directly to the vehicle's CAN bus network. All the signal data to the towing module comes from a direct connection to the vehicle's CAN HI, CAN LO wires.

Programmed to the vehicle.

The Bootloader interface programme's the module to the car. You may choose to have a Bootloader yourself, or we will programme your module to a specific vehicle before dispatching it to you.

 $You \, can \, also \, manually \, re-programme \, the \, Smart CAN2 \, module \, \, without \, a \, Bootloader \, if \, needed.$

Warnings

- Disconnecting the battery: If you do disconnect the battery, make sure the ignition is switched off before you disconnect. Only disconnect for the shortest possible time.
- NOTE: The connections to CAN HI and CAN LO have to be excellent, and soldering is not recommended because of
 potential heat transfer to sensitive circuits in the car, so each kit includes two red Positap connectors. We
 strongly recommend their use for this interface.

Overload protection: As well as the fuse protection you put on the input cables, the module has on board protection against overloads - it will shut down any lighting circuit that shorts, etc. In service, making this a very durable unit.

The module sends trailer data back to the vehicle: Some vehicles automatically accept data back from the unit and alter some functions when a trailer is connected. Some require a re-code before they do this and others react partially without a re-code, adding new functions when they have been re-coded.

(Check the compatibility list / compatibility QR code on last page to see if your vehicle is a read only set up, or needs recoding for extra functions).

For 12S/full function, add TF1018S Split-charge supplementary kit.

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


Diagram shows 13 Pin wiring as fitted to rear of socket using corresponding numbers & colours as shown

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
Procedure

- 1. Make sure the module has been programmed to the vehicle (See note below)
- 2. Remove panelling as required.
- 3. Disconnect the battery.
- 4. Find a good earth point and connect the white wire from the module, using the ring terminal provided.
- 5. Thread the sleeved wires out of the car and connect to the 13-pin socket. Connect the socket to the mounting plate.
- 6. Lead the wires from the module through the vehicle to their appropriate connection points.
- 7. CAN 1: Use the instructional pictures provided to identify the CAN connection points, Cut the twisted pair from the module's CAN wires to length and connect to the vehicle's CAN wires using two of the Positap connectors provided.
- 8. CAN 2 (If needed See installation pictures)
 When you cut the module's twisted pair, you were left with a length with connectors. Insert these connectors into plug chambers 5 (CAN Lo) and 6 (Can Hi) on the CAN module plug. Fit the other ends to the vehicle's CAN wires as indicated.
- 9. Hard brake connection (If needed See diagram above) Take the red wire from pin 7 of the module and connect it to one of the wires to the brake lights, using a snap connector (Scotchlok). This provides an optional analogue backup to the braking system. It is required in some European countries.)
- 10. Power connection
 - The red wire that runs from both pins 15 and 18 is for power to the module. Use the Fusetap connector provided to take power from the vehicle's fuse box. Check your installation then insert the 15amp fuse in the Fusetap and test.
- 11. Restore all paneling etc.

Note: The module may have been programmed to the car by us before dispatch or you may have chosen to have your own Bootloader unit to set it up for the car you are fitting to.

Alternatively, you can programme it manually. If you scan the top QR code on the right, you will see a YouTube video showing how to do this.
